

Flag Day

Flag Day commemorates June 14, 1777, when the Continental Congress determined the composition of the nation's banner: "Resolved, that the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation.

The holiday is a time to celebrate American values, including freedom, unity, and patriotism.

To properly honor the flag, you want to be sure you're displaying it correctly: Raise the flag briskly and lower it ceremoniously. Never allow the flag to touch the ground or floor. The flag should never be transported flat or horizontally, but always aloft.

Symbolism of the flag elements:

Stars:

The 50 white stars on a blue field represent the 50 states of the United States.

Stripes:

The 13 alternating red and white stripes represent the 13 original colonies that formed the nation.

Colors:

- RED: Symbolizes hardiness, valor, and courage, representing the readiness to sacrifice for the country.
- WHITE: Represents purity, innocence, and independence from other countries, reflecting the nation's core values and ideals.
- BLUE: Represents vigilance, perseverance, and justice, symbolizing the nation's commitment to upholding its principles and ideals.


The flag's design and symbolism are rooted in the nation's history, with the stars and stripes













The Power of Bended Knee

Birds go to sleep on theirs perches, but they never fall off. This is because the tendons in the bird's legs are constructed so that when the leg is bent at the knee, the claws contract and grip like a steel trap. The claws refuse to let go until the knees are unbent again. The bended knee gives the bird the ability to hold on to his perch so tightly.

Isn't this also the secret of holding power of the Christian? Daniel found this to be true. Surrounded by pagan environment, tempted to compromise with evil, urged to weaken his grip on God, he refused to let go. He held firm when others faltered because he was a man of prayer. He knew the power of the bended knee, from sleeping birds we can learn the secret of holding things which are precious to us – honesty, purity, thoughtfulness, honor and character. That secret is the knee bent in prayer, seeking to get a firmer grip on those values which make life worth living. When we hold firmly to God in prayer, we can rest assured he will hold tightly to us.

Annual Report are asked to have them submitted by January 12th. Thank you.


Session Board Meeting Summary

Sunday Funday will be December 1 from 4-6 p.m. All Mission donations are up to date for the missionaries. Diaconate is gearing up for the Christmas season. We will be hanging the greens on Sunday, December 1 after worship. We hope many will stay to help decorate. You may be contacted to light the Advent candle on one of the 4 Sundays in December before Christmas. Trustees have had the handicap toilet in the ladies restroom raised and moved. A new grab bar has been installed. We also addressed more boiler issues. Also we are hiring a new cleaning person. December 15 Flutes for Vets will be hosting a holiday recital in the Sanctuary. test. Always be on guard and remember tht you carry the name of Christ on your shoulders when you call yourself "Christian."







part of who you are is what's inside you.


